HOUSING: Volunteers Needed for Homeless Count



Held on Wednesday, January 24, 2024, the Point-in-Time (PIT) Count is a crucial census of individuals who are unhoused in Yamhill County. The PIT Count helps secure federal, state, and private funding while also determining the effectiveness of programs addressing the housing crisis.


To conduct the countywide event, a combination of staff and volunteers are needed to establish count stations at drop-in sites and canvass the streets in each community. During the count, individuals who are unhoused receive survival supplies and food. HOUSING: AnyDoor Place Newberg Opening Soon



YCAP is thrilled to announce the new AnyDoor Place Newberg navigation center will be opening soon and brings with it enhanced resources for individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Newberg. The construction and land use process took patience and diligence, but the final result will be an expanded shelter with a day center and offices for on-site case managers and community partners.

These additional resources will help individuals and families move more quickly from homelessness into stable housing either directly or through partnership with YCAP's Turnkey Program. For families with simpler barriers, on-site YCAP case managers will be able to expedite their transition back into stable housing.

For individuals with more complex barriers, the future addition of office and meeting space will enable on-site partners to connect people to physical, mental, and behavioral health supports. If it is determined that an individual or family would benefit from a longer-term shelter placement, they can be referred into the Turnkey Program as space becomes available. By developing this continuum of services, individuals and families who need additional smaller steps to reach housing stability can keep moving forward.



Services available at AnyDoor Place will include:

- Resource bridging
- Bottomless coffee
- Snacks
- Laundry
- Toiletries & hygiene supplies
- Restrooms with showers
- Mobile device charging
- Telephone
- Mailing services
- Computer & internet access



YOUTH OUTREACH: Helping Youth Achieve Housing Stability



YCAP's Transitional Living Program (TLP) is focused on helping youth aged 18-24 transition successfully to stable housing, achieve independence, and thrive in life. Typically, this program has been funded by a Federal grant through the Department of Health and Human Services, but last year the government did not provide an opportunity to submit a proposal for renewing this support.

TLP is a very cost effective program that helps 16 Yamhill County youth each year who are experiencing homelessness through a shared apartment model of four youth per apartment. The program includes access to long-term shelter (up to 18 months) and essential social services such as life skills, counseling, education support, job readiness, and aftercare to ensure youth stay stably housed and employed after leaving the program. With a 75% success rate for youth who transition into stable housing, it provides a safe, effective, and youth focused alternative to night by night shelter. The cost of the program is approximately \$125,000 per year, and YCAP needs to raise \$50,000 to bridge the gap until the federal grant hopefully returns in 2024.

FEED HOPE 2023

During FEED HOPE, the community gathers shelf-stable food and funds for YCAP's Food Bank to deliver hope to families in need. 
ENERGY SERVICES: Utility Assistance Success Story



A family reached out to Energy Assistance because their household's electricity, water, and sewer services were set to be shut off. Due to health issues, one spouse was unable to work, and the other had to leave her job to care for him full time. This household also has two young children as well as one infant. The loss of vital utility services represented a major health and safety risk for this young family.

Fortunately, the Energy team was able to assist with electric, water, and sewer balances, paying off their accounts and leaving them with sustaining credits to get them through this challenging time. When the client was notified, she expressed through tears of joy that she and her family were "So very grateful for all that YCAP does for the community" and were "Truly thankful to the Energy team for helping to keep our family's utility services active, which will ultimately provide safety, good health, and security for our home during these difficult times."
